FROM THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

Garbage Talk:

We have experienced an increasing number of home owners not using garbage bags in their garbage bins. Garbage is being thrown loosely into garbage bins; creating unsanitary conditions in garbage bins, a risk of falling debris when your bin is being dumped and an increased potential for loose garbage to be blown out into our Village as it is tipped into our garbage truck. It has long been Village policy that garbage is to be placed securely inside a garbage bag. Otherwise, our Public Works will not attempt to pick up your garbage bin of loose garbage. When our Public Works crew makes the decision not to pick up your bin, he or she will leave a tag on your garbage bin explaining the reason for not collecting your garbage.

From time to time, we must change the schedule of our garbage routes to meet other obligations. The following requests are intended to make garbage pickup more efficient and to avoid misunderstanding and frustration when you miss garbage pickup.

- Please have your garbage carts out by 7:00AM on the pickup day, at curbside. If they are not at the curb, they will not be picked up.
- Please keep garbage in the proper container and make sure the lids are closed this will assist with collection and keep animals and birds out; keeping our streets tidy.
- Please ensure all household waste is bagged. Loose garbage will not be picked up.
- Please ensure that garbage cans are brought back off the streets the same day as collection. If you won't be home, think about asking

your neighbour to help by wheeling your garbage bin back to your garage.

- It is important to have your garbage cart placed out on the curb properly. Park the wheels away from the road and just off the roadway. Arrows on the lid of the cart should point to the middle of the road. Space the garbage bin at least two meters away from vehicles or other objects. Items that are not in a cart will not be picked up.
- What goes in a garbage cart? All household waste that is not recyclable. No explosives or corrosive material, tires, batteries, drywall, animal carcasses, oil or filters, electronic equipment.

Each residence is issued a garbage cart. It is the owner's and/or occupier's responsibility to maintain these carts. You may have to spray it out from time to time to keep it clean and odour free. Replacement carts can be purchased for \$93.00 plus tax from the Village Office.

The landfill, operated by the Regional District of Bulkley Nechako, is located on Fraser Lake Airport Road. For more information call 250-692-3195 or 1-800-320-3339.




SNOWFLAKE TEA, CHRISTMAS CRAFT & HOME BASED BUSINESS FAIR
