The Village of Fraser Lake is launching an age-friendly action planning process to help make our community more age-friendly. The process is being fully funded by the provincial Age-Friendly Communities Program and completed by Whistler Centre for Sustainability.

An age-friendly community is one where older adults can "age actively" – that is, to live in security, enjoy good health, and continue to participate fully in society. And the good news is that becoming age-friendly not only improves quality of life for seniors, it also creates a more inclusive, safe and accessible community for everyone.

Our age-friendly assessment and planning process will occur from February to June 2019 and will cover these World Health Organization age-friendly themes, which are used extensively by other communities and cities within and beyond Canada:

- 6. Social participation in arts/culture, recreation, leisure, learning, etc.

- 8. Civic participation and employment
