#### ENDAKO AVENUE SIDE-WALK REPLACEMENT

The Village is replacing the sidewalk along Endako Avenue between Carrier Crescent and Chowsunket Street. The curb, gutter and asphalt sidewalk were in poor shape, and we are in full construction on this sidewalk project. Trucks and equipment are working hard to complete this work. We have placed detour signs at either end of the construction zone. Residents who need to access the area to get home can do so. The Village will ask motorists and pedestrians to use a different route to make your way across town

The construction is progressing well. The section adjacent to the library and Kin Park is nearing completion. The availability of cement trucks is impacting the speed of progress; however, we are impressed with how fast this small crew is proceeding. Repairs to the lawn will be required following construction of the sidewalk. We appreciate your patience while this work is completed. In terms of appearance and accessibility, the inconvenience and wait will be worth it. Thank you.

#### BOAT LAUNCH UPGRADES

The Village continues to improve the boat launch facility. This year we replaced the wood pilings on either side of the launch. Unfortunately, the ice had deteriorated enough that it wouldn't hold the excavator that was installing the steel pilings this will be completed next winter. Solar lights were installed on the top of the pilings; and concrete pads were installed on either side of the launch to improve the function and appearance of the area. With all the improvements we have a wonderful boat launch facility for residents and visitors to enjoy this summer.

#### VFL COMMUNICATIONS

The WCI Crew is back and making good headway on construction of the broadband network. While conduit is installed at the east end of town, CityWest technicians are busy installing the fiber optic cable in the network of conduit that was installed last

fall on the west end of town. The WCI Crew works a 20 days on/10 day off rotation. They will be on the job until June 21th. They will take their 10-day break and be back in full force July 4, 2022. A second crew will join the project toward the end of June.

Supply chain challenges that we have all experienced over the past two years have impacted the project. The electronic controls (the brain) of the system are a month late but it will arrive for installation by July 4th. In the meantime, the City-

West technicians will be wiring homes that have preregistered for fiber optic service. Although it is expected to take as long as to the end of the summer to complete all the work needed to connect every home and business in Fraser Lake, those properties that have been fully installed will "*go live*" on July 18<sup>th</sup>. We can hardly wait! Two people who have been receiving fiber optic service through CityWest: one in Houston, B.C. and one in Smithers, B.C. state the service is stable, reliable, and fast "all the time". If there is a disruption, it because of something that is way beyond anyone's control. This new service for our community is partially owned by the community. Any revenues generated by this service, is split with CityWest and our portion comes back to Fraser Lake to benefit our community. In effect, we are all owners of this telecom. Please support local. Did you know that the Village of Fraser Lake has canoes, paddleboards and all the safety gear? The equipment is available for a minimal daily fee through Everyday Grocery Store. You can use this equipment to write your own adventure. Visit Everyday Grocery Store for more information.

#### **Municipal Property Taxes and Home Owner Grants**

Municipal Property taxes have been mailed out and are due July 4, 2022. After July 4, 2022, a 10% penalty will be applied.

The home owner grant reduces the amount of property tax you pay for your principal residence. Residents must apply for the home owner grant either online at <a href="mailto:gov.bc.ca/">gov.bc.ca/</a> homeownergrant, or by calling 1-888-355-2700 directly to the province. The online application is fast, easy and secure. To avoid penalty, the home owner grant must be applied for and approved by July 4, 2022.

If you <u>qualify for the home owner grant</u>, you must apply each year to receive it. Anyone with your permission can apply for you on your behalf.

When you apply, you will need your social insurance number to verify your eligibility. Your personal information is encrypted at the time of entry to ensure your information is kept secure

If you are paying your property taxes through online banking, ensure to make your payment early enough to avoid the penalty charge of 10%. Online payments take 3 to 5 business days to process. Payment must be received in the Village's bank account no later than July 4, 2022.
